_____ "Law Enforcement is a Big Job"

- Practice one way police gather evidence: by taking fingerprints.
- Visit your local sheriff's office or police station or talk with a law enforcement officer visiting your den or pack to discuss crime prevention.
- Help with crime prevention for your home.
- Be sure you know where to get help in your neighborhood. With your parent or guardian, get to know the people in your neighborhood who can help you in an emergency. Make a list of those people and their phone numbers.
- Learn the phone numbers to use in an emergency and post them by each phone in your home.
- Know what you can do to help law enforcement. Don't put yourself in danger! Get all the information you can, then tell an adult or call the police. Get the facts:
 - Where is it happening?
 - What's happening?
 - Who is doing it?
 - Can you describe the people and their clothes?
 - Did you get the license number?
